Condiments (mayo, ketchup, mustard)
Breakfast cereals
Boxed milk – dairy, almond and oat – one quart size



All money will be used for bus tokens for people needing transportation to Medical Care

Nursing students studying through the Oregon Health Sciences University, OHSU, located on the OIT Campus, have the opportunity to practice "Street Nursing" in Klamath Falls as part of their Community Health Nursing Experience. They spend several days working as a team with nursing faculty and knowledgeable community workers getting acquainted with some in the unsheltered community. The students learn about the unique health challenges of living on the street. They offer nursing care through foot soaks, if clients are interested. Many of the unsheltered Klamath are 50 years old or older, which is considered elderly when you are chronically homeless. Many have numerous chronic and acute health problems, many of these conditions are untreated.

Sometimes all a person might need is a bus token to get to the Emergency Department or to their doctor. The Street Nursing Program is grand-funded, but they do not have funding for patient transportation. A small number of bus tokens, maybe 10-20, would enable the nursing students to help clients with transportation to health services if needed.
